General Requirements	Applicants must be enrolled at Kagoshima University's partner university at the time of application. Also, they must be continuously enrolled until the end of the exchange period . Exchange students must cover their living expenses while in Japan (Around 100,000 JPY/month is needed.). Extension or shortening of exchange period is not permitted after submitting application. Exchange Students need to leave Japan as soon as classes finish.

<u>Japanese Language and Culture Classes for</u> <u>International Students (SJP)</u>

Exchange students need to take the placement test at the start of the Exchange Program. The result will determine the level you should be placed in. Students with beginner level or no Japanese language learning experience will automatically be placed in level 1. Students can take classes according to their level, from the beginner level where you learn Japanese for the first time, up to the advanced level (equivalent to JLPT N1).

Japanese language proficiency is not required.

However, if you have not studied Japanese before, sufficient English proficiency is required.

Sufficient English language proficiency (i.e., able to understand the classes, speak, and write assignments on their own.)

Visa Information	Before applying for a visa, students need to apply for a Certificate of Eligibility (CoE) for resident status at the regional Immigration Service Agency of Japan. International Student Office will act as a proxy and apply for the CoE on behalf of the exchange students. Expected fees	Insurance: International students who stay in Japan more than 3 months must join the National Health Insurance. Once they are insured under the National Health Insurance, students need to pay only 30% of the actual cost. The premium is about 2,000 yen per month. In addition, it is mandatory to enrol in "Personal Accident Insurance for Students Pursuing Education and Research (Gakkensai)" and "Comprehensive Insurance for Students Lives Coupled with "Gakkensai" for International Students (Inbound futai-gakuso)". They should also join overseas traveler's and health insurance programs available in their home countries. Students can register for the National Health Insurance, PAS and Inbound futai-gakuso after arriving in Kagoshima.
